dispatch and we are very grateful for your understanding and patience.

We have another bumper 24 page newsletter for you this edition.

The news that's buzzing around just now is the RM500 miniature sheet Stampex Overprint. It has collectors in a highly excitable state. Not something you necessarily associate withy sedate stamp/cover collecting people. This is the second such sheet which will be, once again, limited and numbered to 7500. It is primarily for encouraging visitors to the Spring Stampex 17–20 February 2016. It very much looks like the Europhilex overprinted sheet was such a success that it is to be repeated for Stampex shows. This may well be excellent for collectors but not good public relations for the Trade or small cover producers. Small cover producers lose out to larger business and that's plainly unfair.

PROBABLY THE BEST HANDSTAMP.....

In 1980 Sponne School, where I taught, was intending to celebrate its 550th anniversary and I was asked to produce an official FDC to commemorate the event, my first school official. The cover design caused no problem, depicting the original chantry school, still in the market square, and a modern part of the present school.


However the handstamp proved more difficult as there was much to include, and after several failed attempts by "A" Level Arts Pupils, the art teacher said he would produce one adding the comment, "No Problem, Mike" (Note it was way before the availability of computers which could do the job, or so I am told!)

The result is the illustration below but not his comments as to how difficult he found it!



However I found out later it took up the best part of a weekend and involved the use of a drawing board, and final reduction to a more manageable size. The result I think is one of the best I've seen (yes, of course I would say that wouldn't I?) Somehow he managed to incorporate a lovely diagram of a French horn together with the rest of the wording as I had told him the cover would have the 1980 Composer stamps due to strong music tradition of the school.

The number sold maybe of interest to you. We sold around 1700, a huge number by today's sales, and decided to service only about 10 extra over and above what was paid for. Of the total I estimate no more than 60-70 were sold to serious FDC collectors.



The vast majority were bought by pupils, their parents and ex pupils, and no doubt most of these are now being used as bookmarks, or languishing drawers and subject to fading How scarce is the cover? How often does it appear in auctions? Its catalogue value was 40.00 for years and years and still stands at around that price I think. So......?

However the quality of the handstamp compares favourably with the best and I wish I could take the credit for its design. Sadly I can't, and even with the aid of a computer the thought of designing a handstamp gives me nightmares so I take my hat off to all those cover producers who do their own designs.

BAC Concorde FDC's from 1969 by......Richard Bennett

1969 saw the first flight of Concorde 001 on the 2nd March 1969 in France, followed closely by 002 on the 9th April 1969 here in the UK from Filton aerodrome, where it was built, to RAF Fairford in Gloucestershire. To commemorate this first flight, a set of stamps were produced by the Royal Mail and a range of FDC illustrations were produced by both the Philatelic Bureau and many other FDC manufacturers. BAC official cover

The British Aircraft Corporation produced an "official" cover for the issue, this example having a Bristol FDI cancel rather than the more frequently encountered Filton FDI.



As can be seen, the Wyvern in the lower left corner confirms the covers were produced by Wessex Covers. Being one of the less common designs, this FDC usually commands a small premium above the P.O. Bureau and other common cachet FDC's.

The interesting thing is that, while 99% of these covers were made for BAC, very small numbers were produced for other companies that contributed to the construction of Concorde. Perhaps the most common is that with a Lever (Tolworth) LTD. inscription, (this example with a Filton FDI) which would merely appear to have had the BAC wording replaced by Levers'.





As well as this, I have FDC's produced for three other contractors - Rose Bearings (above) with a similar substitution, but including the Wyvern symbol, and also for C.F. Taylor and Universal Fisher Engineering (below) both with an additional "Official Cover" text above and below "Concorde".

Other types

As well as the different contractors, I have also seen an example for MEA (Middle Eastern Airways) one of the airlines that initially had options on two Concorde's. So my question is – does anyone in the GBFDC have other examples? If MEA had some made, did the other airlines which had options also have some? And what of the other suppliers like Rolls Royce (Olympus engines)?

These contractor customised FDC's would actually appear to be rarer than hen's teeth, so I would be really interested to learn of any other examples with different logos. If you have any, do please send me details or a scan to: sermb1@yahoo.co.uk and I'll collate them and revert back in a future edition of the newsletter with any additional variations.

LITTLE GEM NESTLING AMONGST MY COVERS

BM / Lufthansa card with a full set of Art & Craft stamps cancelled 2nd May 2000

I bought this card sometime in 2001/2002 and the person I got it from told me to hold on to it as it was one of those cards that would rise in value. As he said that about many covers I purchased from him and most of them didn't realise their projected potential, I thought this one would be the same. After all it's only a card!!

It has nestled safely in my album ever since. At the middle of 2015 I found out my mobility will never get any better, indeed, it will get worse. After being told this I took stock of my situation and I realised I would need a power wheelchair. So, in order to finance this, I decided to sell my cover collection to people who would appreciate them. I did include the cover below in one of my lists in the MCS last year. A very kind GBFDC member telephoned me to tell me that the cover was valuable. Phil did some research for me and she found one that was offered for sale by Steven Scott in 2004 for £250. So I contacted a friend in the know and he confirmed its value.

Apparently there are two versions of this card, a British one and a French one. The French one has a French address printed in the bottom right of the card, the UK versions don't as the stamps are usually put on the card lower down so you can't see the French address. The French cards DO have the French stamp on the rear the UK ones don't have anything. There were around 10-15 UK cards serviced, and no more than 10, maybe less, of the French cards serviced. I am reliably informed that the UK card would be valued in the region of £200-£250 and the French card £250-£300




Here are two scans of the card I have. The front bears the French address but underneath the stamps is glued (very professionally) an oblong piece of white paper and the stamps are affixed very neatly over this. The stamps are then cancelled with the official handstamp. It is highly possible that the paper is covering an address but one cannot see underneath it to be certain.

On the reverse of the card is the necessary French stamp cancelled with a Paris handstamp. It is addressed to a gentleman in Germany.

So my card is quite valuable and should sell for a lot more than the price I had on it last year.

I thought other members would be interested in this card as it will be missing from most collections. If you do have one then check it to see which version, British or French, that you have. Both are fairly valuable.

Fig.1 - Is a Brittany Ferries own A5 envelope to which had been added a Condor Ferries Royal Mail generated label (these are taking over meter marks very quickly. So this could be a new area of collecting?) Nick has affixed two sets of Post & Go Sea Travel stamps and all are cancelled with Post & Go Sea Travel, Southampton 16.9.15 handstamp. Your efforts paid of Nick, a very nice, and unusual, cover indeed.



Fig 2. Is a Royal Mail fdc for the Sea Travel Post & Go stamp issue. Nick has, once again, affixed a Condor Ferries Royal Mail generated label and a full set of Post & Go Sea Travel stamps. This time the stamps are cancelled with Bon Voyage, Dover handstamp.



Fig. 3. Is another of Nick's special FDCs, this time for the Bees issue on the 18.08.15.

Nick is an avid collector of beer labels on cover and this cover has an exceptional connection. The beer is called Waggle Dance, you will see it on most supermarket shelves; the Bees miniature sheet depicts the Waggle Dance. Bees perform this dance to communicate the direction and distance to flowers yielding nectar and pollen.

The stamps are cancelled by St. Bees handstamp.


No.1 - 9th July 1980 Famous People Eisteddfod OFFICIAL with a FULL SET (slight foxing but still scarce)

No.2 - 24th June 1981 National Trusts Spastics OFFICIAL with FULL SET.





No.4 - 5th September 1995 Rowland Hill FULL SET on the Royal Mail OFFICIAL cover.


This cover was produced by Royal Mail and was only done with TWO STAMPS. So some enterprising person put the rest of the stamps on and got

These covers were done with the one stamp from the miniature sheet but I got my cover from a reputable dealer who did only TWO covers with the FULL MINIATURE SHEET



No 6 - 6th Nov 2007 St Pancras OFFICIAL with a FULL SET and MINIATURE SHEET These TWO covers were done by myself where I had to beg for the covers off the sponsor but gave a

donation to their charity which was fair enough as I think now that they are quit scarce. I have seen these covers on ebay but NOT with full set and never seen the miniature sheet.

Concerning Registration marks on older covers By Selwyn Goodacre

I am encouraged by Richard Bennett's excellent and interesting article on Registration marks (*FD Coverage* 130, December 2015) to expand a little on my own article on such covers ((*FD Coverage* No. 95 April 2010).

Richard restricts his account to years up to 1957 only. But of course the system of registering and numbering covers persisted for some while after 1957 – up to around 1993 when the system gave way to 'Special Delivery'. In trying to ascertain just how many Registered covers in any one issue were processed in this way, one is dependent on specialist collectors like Richard – and myself (in all modesty) who collect covers in series, rather than just buying a single example.

As regards my own speciality of the Year of the Child issue, I mentioned in my earlier article that I had good reason to think that 'some (of the registered) covers were almost down to single figures'. Let me explain:

As regards registered covers with the Far Sawrey CDS, I found that every one I had details of (most of them in my collection) were all numbered between 157450 and 157510 – i.e. 60 in total. Further – the numbers in each commercial category were even more closely linked.

Philart Covers numbered 157450; 157453; 157454; 157456; 157457; 157459.

Cotswold covers came next - 157460; 157462; 157464; 157468 (note that they follow sequentially from the Philart covers)

Next came Post Office covers – 157477; 157479; 157482; 157483; 157484; 157486; 157487; R157505; R157510

Two Peter Scot traffic light gutter pairs slot in the middle of the Post Office covers - 157498; 157499

My conclusions from this are that the Philart covers were only 10 in total; as were Cotswold covers; Post Office covers probably numbered between 30 and 40. Peter Scot – the numbers are too small to make an educated guess, but allowing for the 'Post Office gap' of 18 the number is unlikely to be more than 10 in total (traffic light gutter pairs are expensive and quite tricky to organise). (It is pleasant to think that I own 20 of the likely total of 60 of Far Sawrey covers!)

As regards registered covers with the Child's Hill, Cricklewood CDS, I have 18 examples, all are Post Office covers – and the numbers all fall between 281509 and 281547 – i.e. 38. All were issued by the same dealer in Markton Hickling, though my covers came from varying sources. It seems pretty likely to me that the total number is unlikely to have been more than 40 – or 50 at a stretch.

The Greetings issues of 1990, 1991, and 1993 all also included a number of registered covers – with CDSs for relevant places such as Giggleswick and 'Bear Park.' But of these I have only a few examples, so have not been able (as yet) to estimate how many covers might have been processed in total. By the time the Greetings issue for 1994 arrived, registering had given way to the 'Special Delivery' system. These also do have numbers involved, but the details are not clear (to me, at any rate).

It is an intriguing area of collecting – and, as Richard Bennett has suggested, we need more cooperation between individual collectors to be able to tie down details even further.

Complete Sheet First Day Covers


Until I acquired such an item, I could hardly believe that covers with a complete sheet of 100 stamps could possible exist. But I do now have four examples. All are (inevitably for me!) from the Year of the Child issue. The accompanying illustration shows one of my four (the other three are for the other three stamps in the issue).

Incredibly every stamp has part of the FDI cancellation on it - and the covers are indeed complete with the name and address of a recipient. The sheet is affixed to a huge card - which measures 46.8 x 39.8cms.

I wrote a speculative letter to the name on the cover, but as I rather expected, it was returned to me, as unknown at that address (It is after all 36 years on!).

I can't think the creator did more than one each of these covers – but I may be wrong – does anyone knows of other examples of a 'complete sheet cover'?






