


## A-Z of Britain - Old Bailey Stamp

Amongst other things, I am a Freeman of the City of London and a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Pattenmakers. One of our Liverymen Wendy Mead was elected a Sheriff of the City of London, which is one of the prerequisites of becoming Lord Mayor - albeit you have to be an Aldermanic Sheriff. During her year she hosted a Dinner in the Judges Dining Room of the Old Bailey, donations being given for one of her charities. Before the Dinner there was a tour of the Central Criminal Court. My wife and I had the pleasure of appearing in the Dock and being "taken down" to the cells. There are two elected Sheriffs each year and until the visit I did not realise that the City of London built, own and run the Old Bailey and that the Sheriffs have accommodation there and one or the other has to be present on duty 24hrs/7days per week.

When the UK A-Z stamps came out one featured the Old Bailey and assuming that the Sheriffs year ran concurrent with the Lord Mayor, I sent a cover to her and asked if she, Alderman Alan Yarrow, and the Under Sherriff (effectively the Chief Executive) could sign it for me. What I did not know, was that her year had ended but she very kindly went to the trouble of contacting her colleagues, as per her note, for which I expressed my grateful thanks. That is the beauty of First Day Cover collecting - you invariably learn something new.





#### Tin Can Mail

Thousands of tiny, inhabited islands are scattered throughout the South Pacific Ocean. Delivering mail to these islands is challenging, but the need to communicate has overcome a great many challenges.

Probably the most well known example of this is the case of Niuafo'ou Island, part of the kingdom of Tonga.

In the late 19th century, this little island was found to grow enormous, meaty coconuts that were important sources of oil used in the manufacturing of soap. This attracted the interest of traders from Germany and Great Britain who would purchase dried coconuts from the growers and ship them off the islands. In the course of their business, the traders needed to communicate with the companies that employed them. With no radio communication, no harbour and only occasional supply ships that could bring the mail, this proved difficult.

Other vessels would pass the island, but with no safe anchorage, a mail exchange was impossible — until one day when a trader saw Niuafo'ou islanders out fishing.

They cut limbs from the native mulberry that were buoyant when put in the water, and these limbs were used to support swimmers while they spearfished.

The traders thought that if the swimmers could use poles to catch and bring back fish, they could easily use poles to go out to a passing ship and to catch the mail and bring it back. Ships would collect mail for Niuafo'ou when they called at Nuku'alofa, the main island in the Tonga chain.

The purser on the ship would place the mail into an empty kerosene or cracker can. When the swimmers approached, the purser would throw the cans overboard for the swimmers to retrieve. Outgoing mail from the island was wrapped in oilcloth and tied to a stick held above the water during the swim out to the ship. The ship would drop a line, and the packet of mail was tied to the line and hauled up to the ship. The mail would be placed into the mailstream at the ship's next port of call. ### SIGNED COVERS - by Ian Balcombe

I attach a scan of a cover that when purchased was signed by Shirley Williams, I subsequently asked Betty Boothroyd to sign it as she is featured on the cover. Margaret Thatcher visited the Rotary Club of London in 2005 in conjunction with the Rotary International Centenary, as she was an Honorary Member of the Club.

By this time she had stopped public speaking but was otherwise still very sharp.

As Honorary secretary I was asked to meet her upon arrival and initially escort her. I asked if she would kindly sign a cover (or two) for me. Which she kindly agreed to do so insisting on getting her usual blue felt pen out of her handbag. She signed it around the illustration as can be seen, but also next to the Dorothy Hodgkin stamp. I did not realise until subsequently that Dorothy Hodgkin was her tutor at Oxford!

The other signature is that of Baroness Helen Hayman, who I mistakenly addressed as the first Lady Lord Speaker but she quite rightly corrected me by saying that she was the First Lord Speaker. The other cover that Margaret Thatcher signed for me was also signed by Barbara Castle.

# KGV halfpenny stamps with the rare Westminster Abbey CDS dated June 22, 1911



In a brief follow-up on David Holl's interesting article in the August 2013 issue of First Day Coverage. 
