



The name of Tony Buckingham is well known to all our readers. Sadly he died in 2016 (Phil and Dot contributed an appreciative obituary to this Newsletter in the June 2016 issue). Tony wrote this entertaining account of his early life and colourful career back in 1997, but the book was not finally published until 2015.

It is a delightful read, full of anecdotes from his first job (the book title!) to the gradual progress towards first day cover dealing. Apparently he was a pretty good cricketer - almost achieving Minor Counties standard. He tends to assume a basic knowledge of the facts of his career, as he is so well aware of them himself – we are less fortunate, so we are never quite certain just where he undertook his teacher training, nor just what teaching post his lovely wife Cath held. Various characters are introduced, though we may be less certain as to just who they all were. But the story bowls along with vigour and enthusiasm.

# **Book Review: continued**

The interest in stamps all started when he was put in charge of the stamp club at the primary school where he taught. He never actually says when he started to specialise in first day covers – in fact they are not mentioned as such until p.164. But by the next page he is discussing the famous 'missing Queen's head' on a 3p stamp, though he does not tell us that it was from the Village Churches issue of 1972 (see my article in First Day Coverage August 2015). To be fair, he does mention it in passing later in the book. Success seems to have come quickly.

From the problems of finding somewhere to live at an affordable price, he is soon able to bid several hundred pounds for a particular philatelic item. The name of Benham suddenly appears on p.166 – with no details about the firm, its title – or anything (I understand that in fact he invented the name, there was no person called Benham at all!). But then this book is not a formal history of Benham / Buckingham, it is an entertaining delight on all aspects of Tony's life – and is to be enjoyed on this level, though I personally would have enjoyed more on the early days of the developing first day cover business – like more on those wonderful early wood cut covers he and Cath created.

We learn a lot about his career in primary school teaching – with entertaining stories of the most strange and eccentric head teachers. Tony is very amusing in his accounts of how he promoted school teams in football and swimming – which he did with considerable success. His energy is hugely impressive, it is no wonder his first day cover business was so effective.

The book closes with his decision to give up teaching and concentrate entirely on his first day coverage business – which is where we all come in – to our mutual benefit. He surely is the great first day cover pioneer. I salute his memory.





# The Joys and Rewards of ultra-specialising by Selwyn Goodacre

We peruse the Booth and Bradbury Catalogues eagerly – to see if we have 'everything' relating to our specific specialty, and we give a sigh of relief as we tick the final entry – thinking "Well that is now complete anyway".


But is it? There are chasms out there that we have not touched at all. Let us look for example at the standard Philatelic Bureau cancellation for the FDCs relating to my own speciality- the Year of the Child 1979. One line in the catalogues, and valued at around £5.50. But I have over 60 different covers all with the standard Philatelic Bureau cancellation.

So we have the Post Office FDC – fine. But then what about also having it with plain gutter pairs of all four stamps? Or traffic light gutter pairs of all four? And for the sake of completeness should we not also have the cover with each stamp individually? Then of course they may have a special logo printed – like 'The Cancer & Leukaemia in Childhood Trust'. Then there is one doubled with a set of 1998 Magical World stamps. One enterprising dealer also persuaded a whole host of 'celebrities' to sign covers – from John Alderton to Edward Woodward. So far I have 15, but I am sure there are more out there. Certainly the designer of the stamps, Edward Hughes also signed covers.

The Birmingham mint issued a fine sterling silver medallic FDC – limited to 5000. Moving onto our standard commercial covers – you have to have FDCs issued by Cotswold, Historic Relics, Mercury, Philart (and they issued 3 different covers). Peter Scot issued large covers – always with traffic light gutter pairs (possibly also with plain gutter pairs – but I haven't got one of those – yet!).

Within these commercial covers – again you can find covers with traffic light or with plain gutter pairs. Some, like Philart, you can also find with just one of the four stamps. I have written in these columns about the Cotswold habit of placing stamps in different formations

(April 2011).



Fleetwood FDCs curiously do not feature in either the Booth or Bradbury Catalogues (possibly because they are an American firm) – but their Year of Child covers are of great interest to the collector, as they used designs by Edward Hughes, who designed the actual stamps. There are five covers in the series – one for each individual stamp, and one for all four. One must of course have the complete set. I am sure Hughes would have signed examples of each of the covers, but I only have the one - so far. Curiously Fleetwood also issued a 'non Edward Hughes' cover – featuring a picture by Faith Jacques instead (she also created different pictures for several other countries for their Year of the Child stamps).

Other commercial FDCs not listed in the catalogues include the Linslade School (see my article in these columns December 2013), and Green & Co. – who issued covers in varying basic colours – I have examples in green, and dark blue (I fear there may be others that I have not yet seen).

There are some commercial firms that only issued covers for the Year of the Child – one has a colour picture of Peter Rabbit as postman, I think this cover was produced by Frederick Warne, the publishers of the Potter books. This is usually found with just the Peter Rabbit stamp, covers with all four are rather scarce.

One of the fascinations of this hobby of FDC collecting is just how wide its scope can be. I reckon there are more YOC Philatelic Bureau covers 'out there' that at present I have no inkling of – so the quest continues.



#### Express Birmingham

Richard opened the meeting at 9pm by welcoming and thanking the Committee members for attending.

Matters arising – Terry advised that the advertising on the Stampex paper bags was not possible due to a waiting list.

It was agreed that that was probably the case and that the images would need to be supplied in advance. Ian also felt that it would be useful to supply the editors with images and details of significant sales in the auction and it was agreed that these details will be supplied. Ian also agreed to contact the Philatelic Exporter and the Stamp Fair and Auction Diary and to enquire about the cost of advertising on ebay. Ian will also make contact with the Philatelic Bulletin. Richard advised that the position of Publicity Officer would be reviewed at the next AGM committee meeting.
